Board as a Service




- Elected to the RIPE NCC Executive Board in May 2011


Reading (lots of reading!)



- And much, much more, with each requiring serious deliberation



Building Consensus






Building Consensus



- We see people disappointed or even angry if their idea isn't accepted and implemented
- We rarely see an single issue that members have a common view on
- The RIPE NCC Survey is important the views of 4,000 people can give a better idea of general feelings than 10 mails on a list
- We have many things to consider and we try to reach consensus within a framework
- We need to act consistently members need to trust that we will not be erratic and have confidence we won't suddenly make big changes that affect them
- It is a serious thing to act outside of the framework
- And no matter what, legal requirements trump everything

To conclude...



- Board members were once like you (and to be honest, they still are) - they come from within the community
- They do an enormous amount of unseen work on what are often incredibly complex issues
- The Board usually reaches consensus after thorough discussion (voting is rarely necessary)
- Members can help a lot understand the difficulties, know that we listen, everything (within reason) is considered, and honest feedback is always appreciated
