RIPE mailings lists are used to discuss the development of the Internet, hear what other technical experts have to say and develop new RIPE policies.

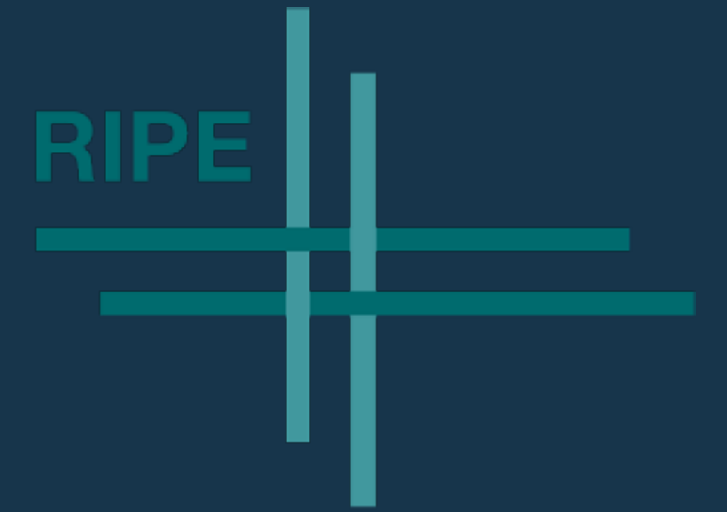

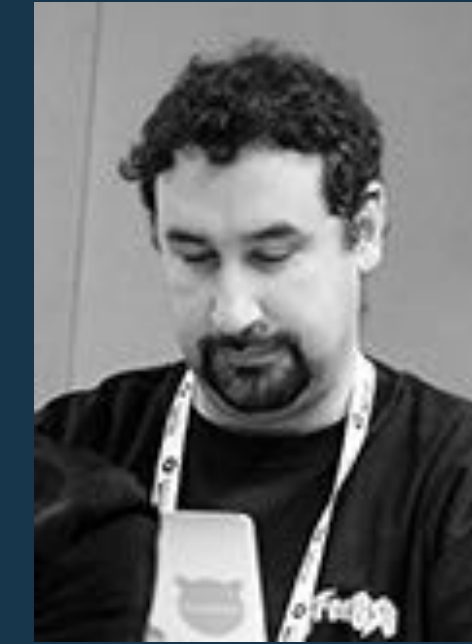

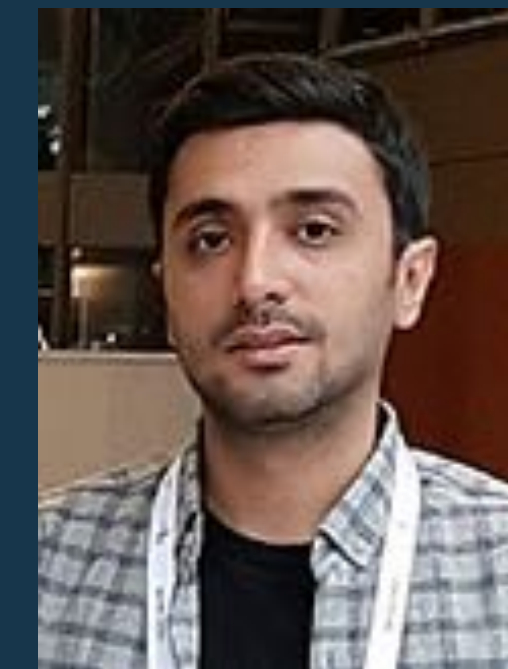

- Investigates hijacks and policy violations
- Supports and facilitates the Policy Development Process with the community
- Ensures secure routing with RPKI

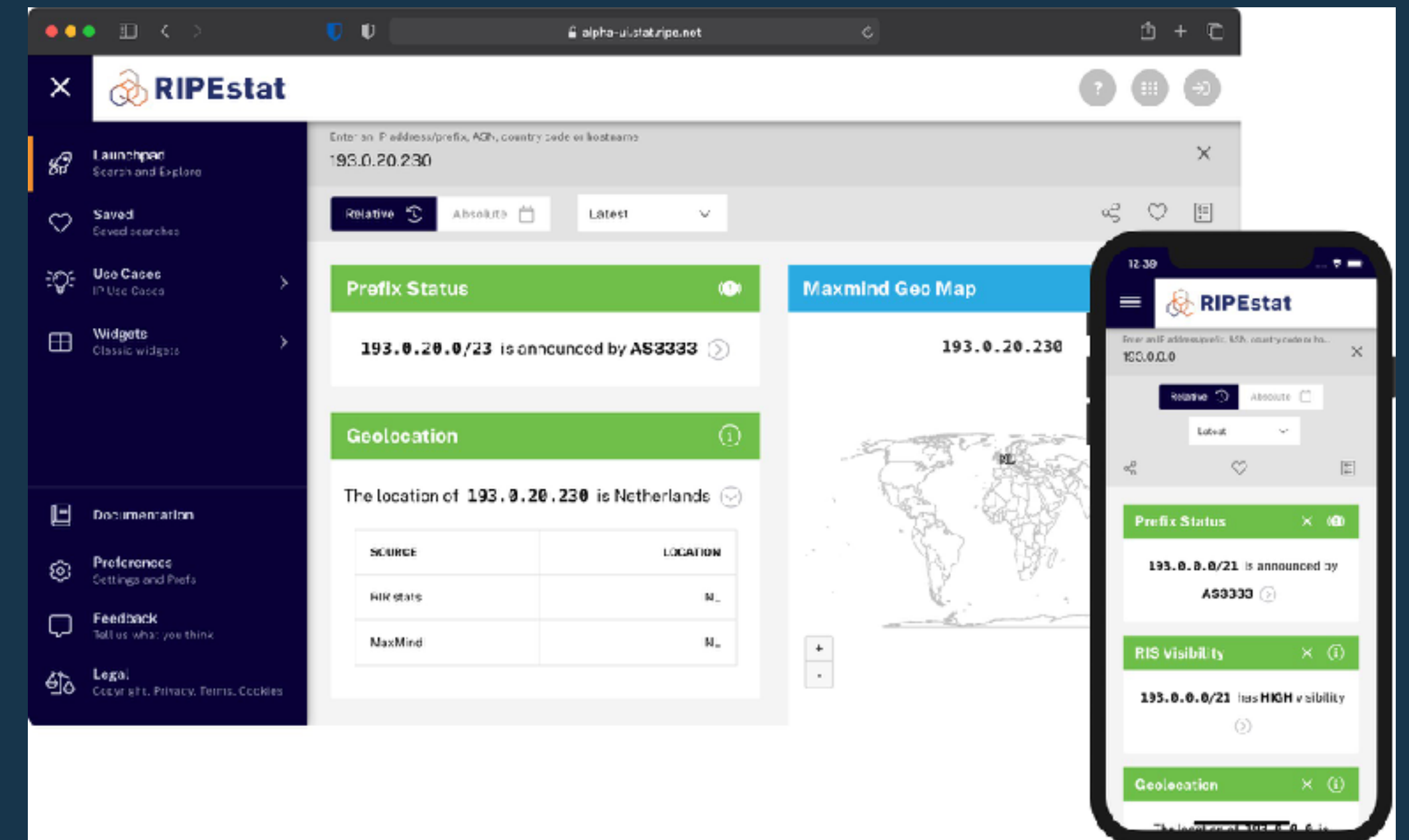


Information Services

/RIPE-NCC

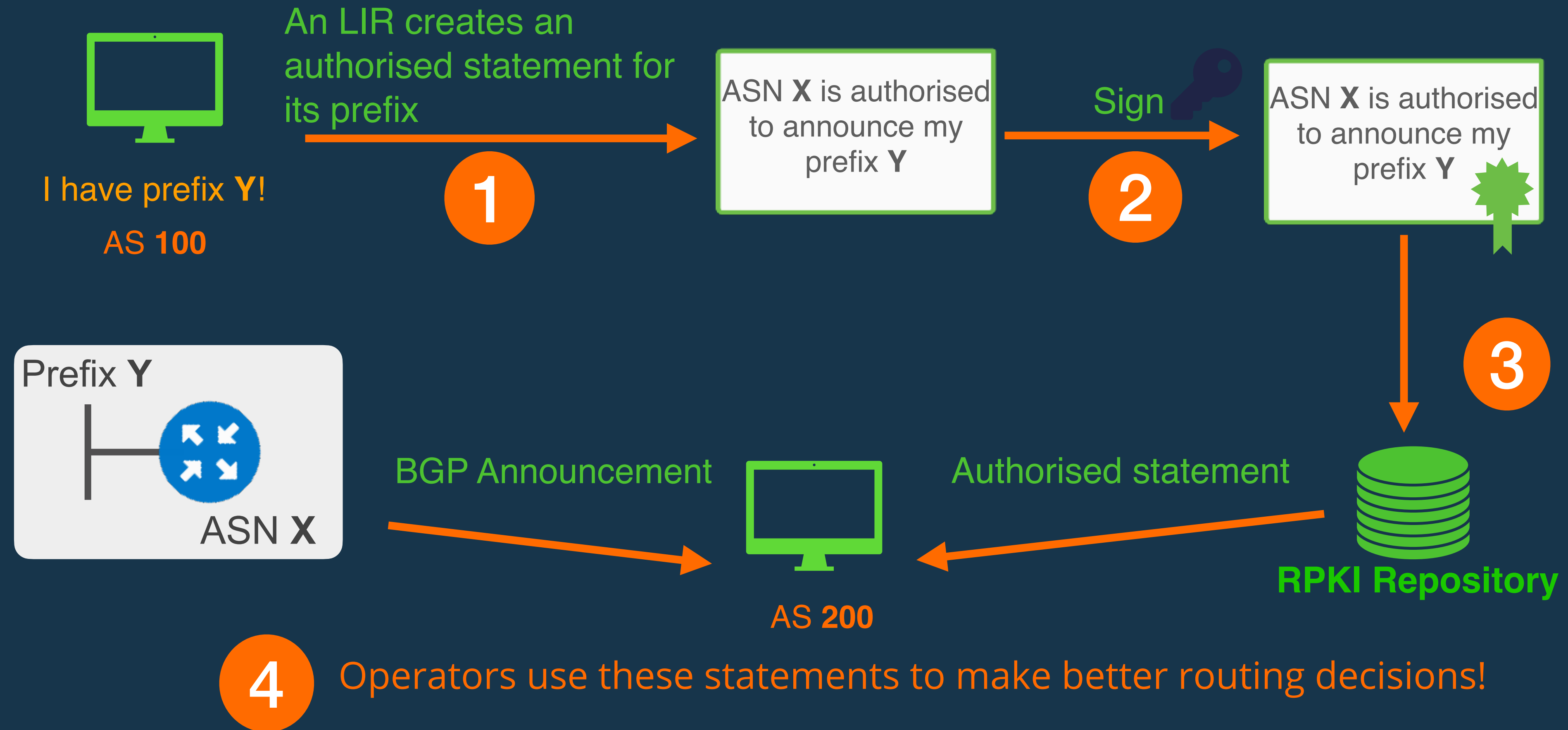


- Develops and maintains Internet measurement services (RIPEstat, RIPE Atlas, RIS, RIPE IPmap)
- Operates K-root, one of the 13 root-name servers
- Delegates reverse DNS zones for the address ranges we manage and provides reliable, authoritative name servers

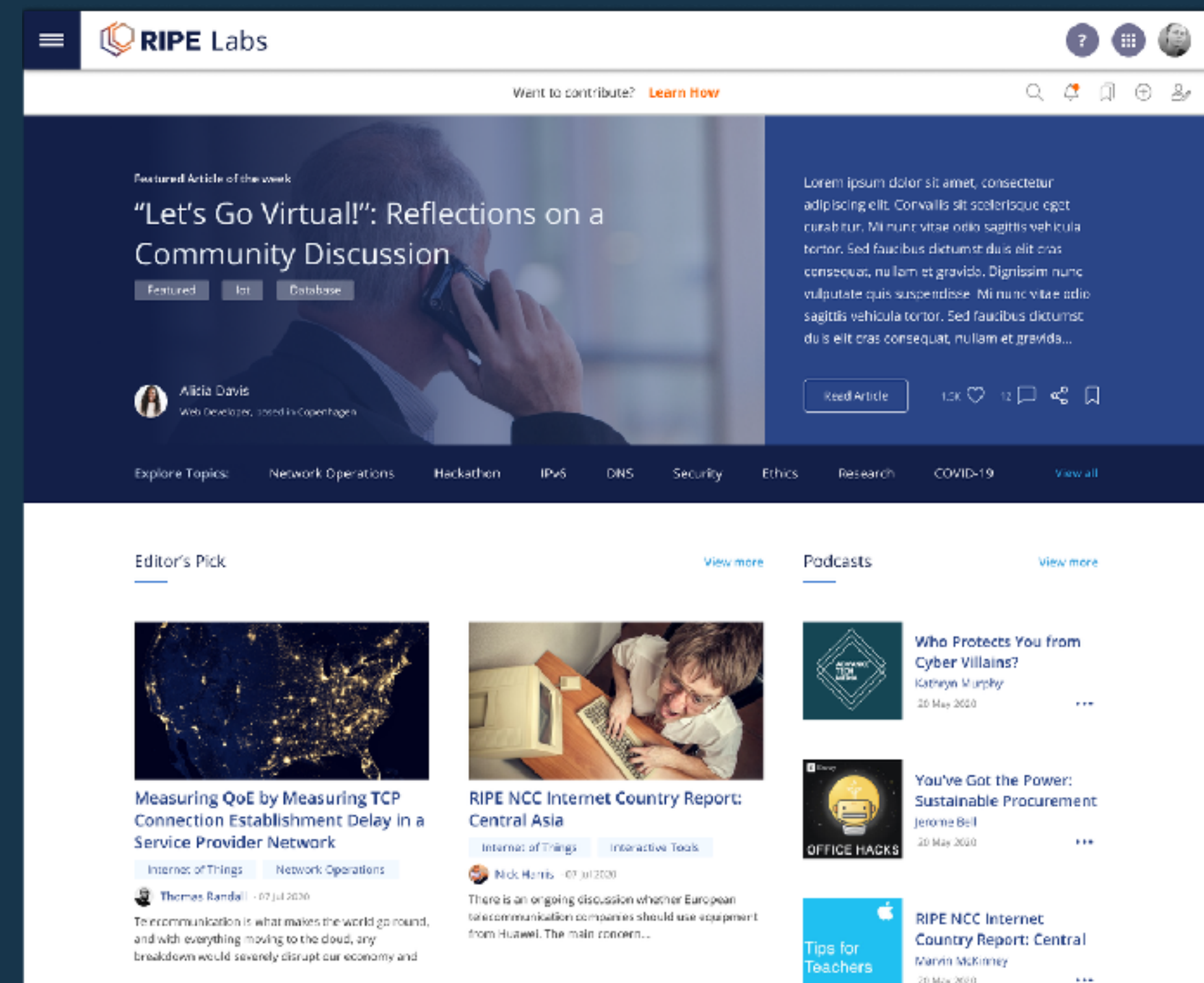


Community and Engagement

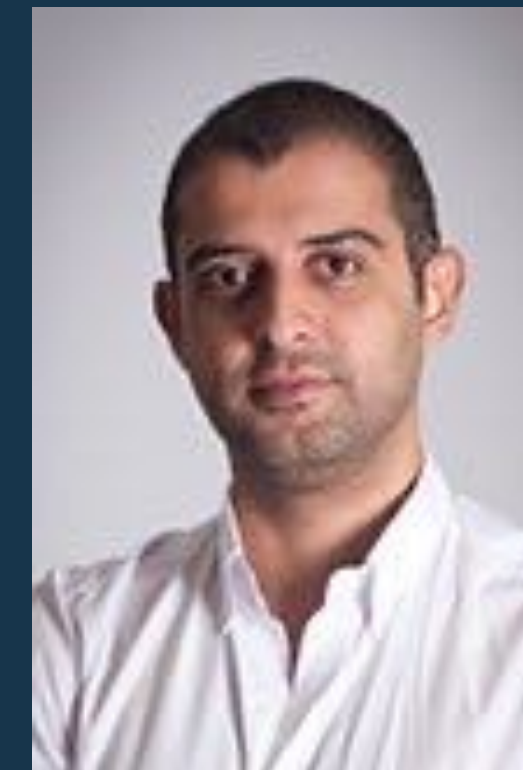

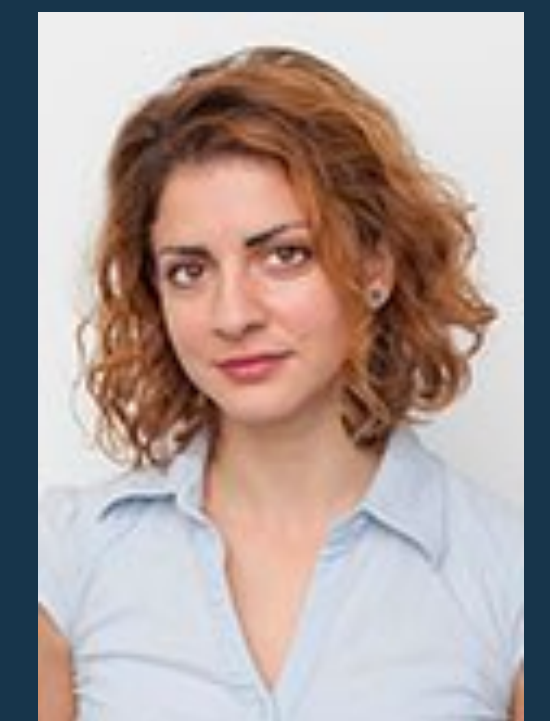

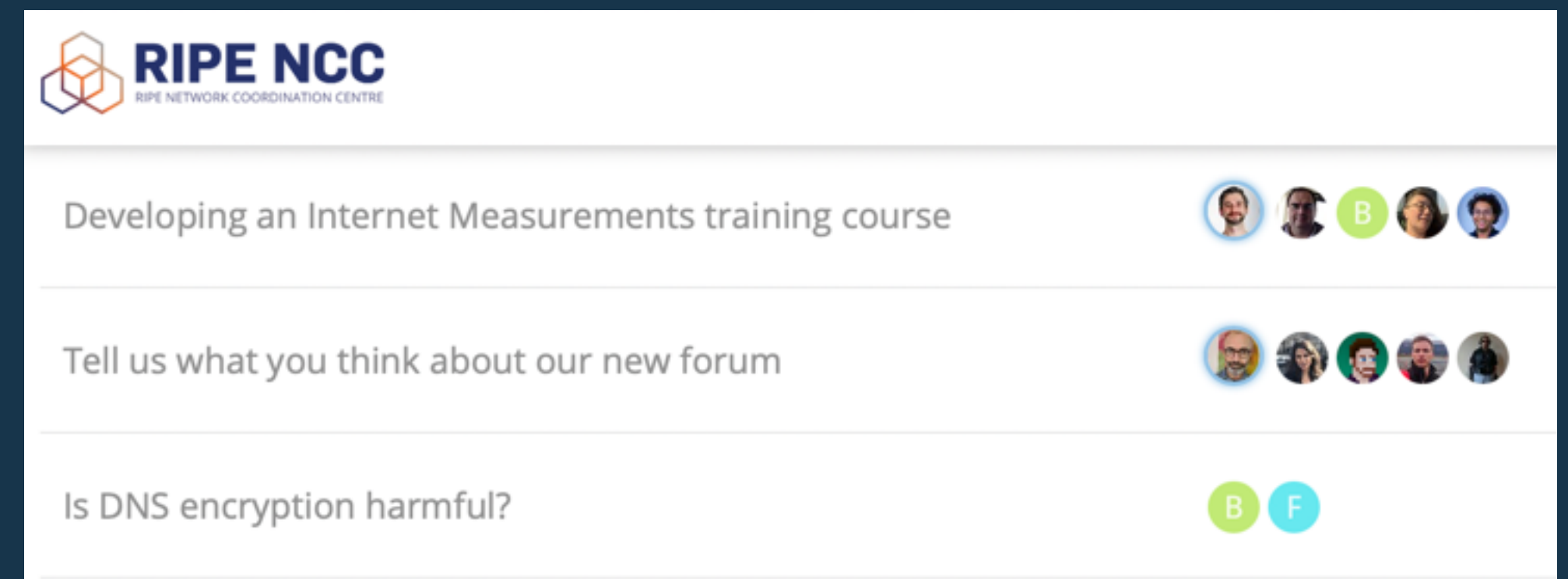
